- Teach overseas in Chinese public or private schools
- Gain hands-on international classroom experience
- Engage in meaningful cultural exchange

- And earn compensation while doing it

This opportunity, organized by AESA Global in partnership with America's educational service agencies, invites passionate educators to work with motivated Chinese students through engaging, project-based learning.

Program Overview

Program Length: Two consecutive weeks

Availability Required: July 6-July 24, 2026

Final program dates (two weeks within this window) will be confirmed by the end of February 2026, following the Chinese New Year.

Location: Shandong and/or Shaanxi Province
(Potential cities include Jinan, Qingdao, Yantai, and Xi'an)

Grade Levels: Grades 5-9

Students: Chinese public or private school students

Teaching Assignment

Subjects: STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) and English (integrated through STEAM/project-based learning)

Schedule:

- Monday-Friday
- Approximately 6 hours per day
- Includes instructional time, hands-on activities, and outdoor games
- 1.5-hour lunch/rest break daily
- Weekends off

Compensation & Benefits

- USD \$2,000 per week (total \$4,000)
- Round-trip international airfare (economy class)
- Four-star or above hotel accommodations
- Three meals per day
- Local transportation between hotel and school
- Emergency medical insurance
- On-site local support

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver engaging, age-appropriate instruction to Grades 5–9 students
- Teach through project-based, hands-on learning
- Support interactive classroom discussion and student collaboration
- Participate in outdoor activities and movement-based learning with students
- Collaborate with fellow educators and local partners
- Serve as a professional and cultural representative of U.S. public education

Qualifications

- Valid U.S. passport
- Minimum 3 years of teaching experience
- Experience with project-based or experiential learning
- Strong classroom management and communication skills
- Flexibility, energy, and adaptability in an international setting
- Ability to work effectively with students whose first language is not English

- **March 2026:** Interviews and lesson theme review
- **Mid-Late April 2026:** Final placement and city assignment confirmation
