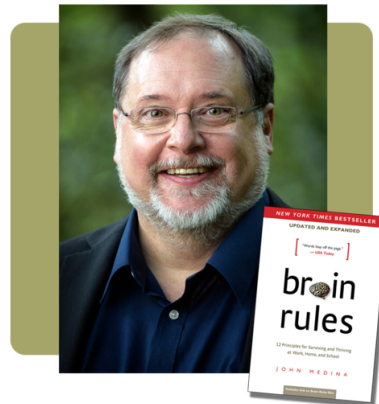


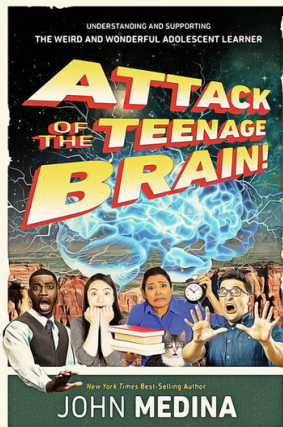
John Medina & Brain Research: Implications for Adolescent Learners
